

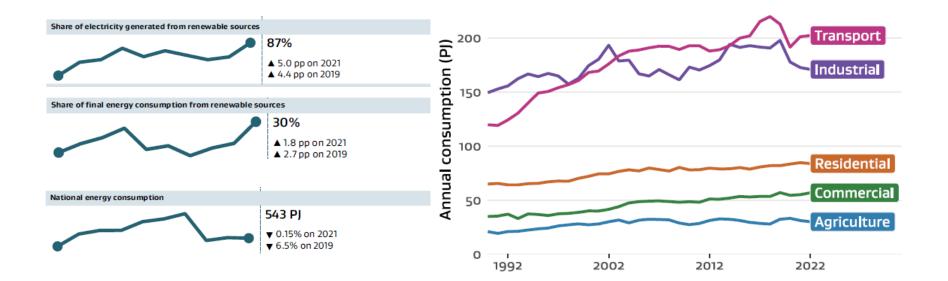

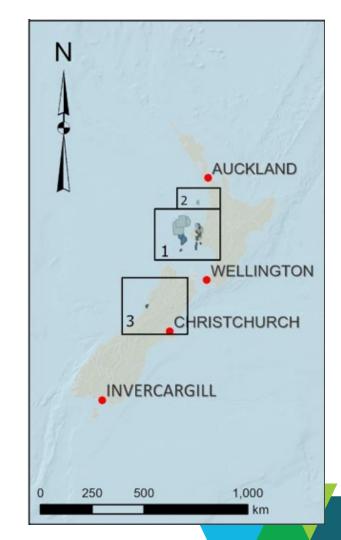


Energy in New Zealand

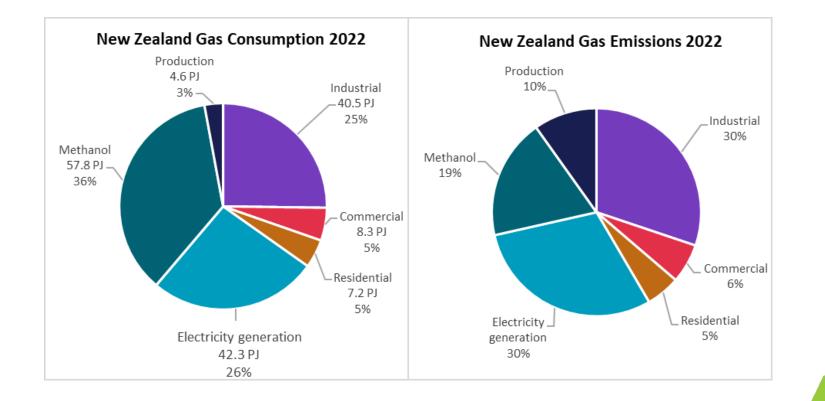


Natural gas

- We have a mix of offshore and onshore fields
- All centred around Taranaki in the west of the North Island
- We currently produce around 145PJ of gas annually down from a high of around 205PJ in 2002
- Oil and gas sector contribute around NZD 1.1b to the economy



What we use gas for



Our gas challenges

- We are not connected to the international gas (LNG) market
- Domestic supply matches demand can cause issues if either changes
- Increasing our renewables mix means an increasing need for flexible supply
- Our ongoing transition to a low emissions future will pose challenges

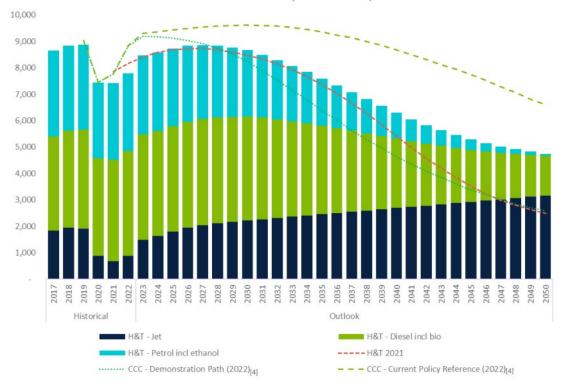
New Zealand faces fuel security challenges

- We import almost all of our engine fuels, mostly from Korea and Singapore
- 40% of our engine fuels pass through the Marsden Point terminal
- New Zealand's isolation, geography and climate makes us vulnerable to supply disruptions
- Changing fuel demand may affect future investment decisions

New Zealand's fuel security measures

- IEA 90-day oil stock obligation mostly met through 'tickets'
- Closure of the Marsden Point refinery in 2022 prompted review of fuel resilience policy
- Minimum stockholding obligation comes into effect 1 January 2025
 - 21 days diesel
 - 24 days jet fuel
 - 28 days petrol
- Government investigating procuring reserve diesel stock
