## Oil and Gas Security Exercise in 2013

APEC Energy Ministerial Meeting Declaration adopted in St. Petersburg, Russia in 2012

The Energy Ministers unanimously agreed to Japan's initiative and instructed the EWG and APERC:

- Work on activities to improve the response to oil and gas emergency situations, including emergency response workshops and exercises.
- Perform these activities in collaboration with the International Energy Agency (IEA) and the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN).
- ➤ APERC decided to carry out "**two Fora**" and "**two Case Study Exercises**" in 2013/2014 in cooperation with the APEC member economies, international/ regional organizations including the IEA and ASEAN, and also IEEJ Headquarters.
  - The objectives of the Exercise are 1) to investigate the domestic systems for emergency preparedness in each APEC economy; 2) to develop possible scenarios of oil and gas emergency situations; and 3) to accumulate the necessary information and analysis by mobilizing capable experts in the APEC region.

### The 1st OGSE fora

### \*Kick-off meeting: The 1st Oil and Gas Security Forum (18-19 April 2013 in Tokyo, Japan)

- 11 experts were invited from APEC member economies and international organizations; 13 APEC member economies sent their delegates to the forum.
- The experts and delegates actively discussed the oil and gas security situation in the APEC region, experience of energy security exercises in international organizations, APEC developed economies and APEC developing economies and also how to organize case study exercises in Thailand and Indonesia.

## **Case Study Exercises (1)**

❖ 1<sup>st</sup> Case Study Exercise was a joint exercise by Southeast Asian APEC economies in

September 2013 in Thailand

- All 7 ASEAN/APEC economies participated in the Exercise: Brunei Darussalam; Indonesia; Malaysia; the Philippines; Singapore; Thailand and Viet Nam.
- Experts from IEA, ASEAN Council on Petroleum (ASCOPE), Heads of ASEAN Power Utilities/Authorities (HAPUA), Economic Research Institute for ASEAN and East Asia (ERIA), Indonesia; Japan; Korea; Thailand; APERC and IEEJ researchers.
- The Exercise presented two stages of emergency scenarios. The first stage, which consisted of three phases, dealt with a common oil emergency situation for the participating economies.
- The second stage, on the other hand, presented scenarios which are unique only to each economy.

### **Case Study Exercises (2)**

### **❖** 2<sup>nd</sup> Case Study: The Jakarta Exercise held in October 2013

- Experts from IEA, ASEAN Centre for Energy (ACE), ASCOPE, HAPUA, ERIA, Indonesia; Japan; Korea; APERC and IEEJ researchers participated.
- In order to investigate the Indonesian system for emergency preparedness in oil, three hypothetical emergency scenarios were developed by APERC.
- Scenarios involved both force majeure and man-made disruptions.

## Oil and Gas Security Initiative (OGSI)

◆The **2014 APEC Ministers Meeting (EMM 11)** in Beijing instructed APERC to continue its work on energy security in collaboration with the IEA, ACE, and other international organizations

- The **OGSI** produced the <u>Oil and Gas Security Exercise Model Procedure (OGS-EMP)</u> (<u>APEC Oil and Gas Security Initiatives (OGSI)</u>, a guidebook that provides a step-by-step approach for economies to conducting supply emergency exercises. The strategies were based on lessons learned from the OGSE.
- > The **OGS-EMP** was published in 2015 and has been used in several exercises since then.



# Oil and Gas Security Exercise (OGSE)

- Six member economies hosted an Exercise. The OGSE was suspended in 2020 due to the pandemic but activated again in 2023. Following were the economies that hosted the Exercise:
  - 1) OGSE in the Philippines (July 2016)
  - 2) OGSE in Australia (October 2017)
  - 3) OGSE in Peru (May 2018)
  - 4) OGSE in Chile (December 2019
  - 5) OGSE in Thailand (September 2023)
  - 6) OGSE in Indonesia (February 2025)
- The OGSE Reports (The Philippines; Australia; Peru; Chile; and Thailand) are posted on the <u>APERC website</u>.
- The latest **OGSE** in Indonesia was held from **3 to 6 February 2025**. Oil and gas experts from international organizations and member economies participated in the Exercise.
  - The preliminary report was presented at the APERC Workshop, and we will draft the report soon.
  - We would like to express our gratitude to the economies that conducted the OGSE and sent experts.
- With the increasing concerns on oil and gas security and fast-evolving threats and disruptions in appear oil and gas supply, we highly encourage APEC member economies to conduct the Exercise. 9

### Oil and Gas Security Network (1)- OGSN Forum

#### Continuing dissemination of information on oil and gas security through forums and Newsletter

- Seven OGSN Forums have been held since 2015 as follows.
  - 1) OGSN Forum in Kitakyushu in April 2015
  - 2) OGSN Forum in Kagoshima in March 2016
  - 3) OGSN Forum in Irkutsk in June 2017
  - 4) OGSN Forum in Tokyo in March 2018
  - 5) OGSN Forum in Sendai in April 2019
  - 6) OGSN Forum (held online due to COVID-19) in April 2023
  - 7) OGSN Forum in Osaka in March 2024
- Members consist of government staff and officials in APEC who are mainly in charge of the oil and gas policies.
- The forum has consisted of presentations and discussions on the oil and gas security measures of APEC members.
- Results of OGSE are also presented.

- Started in 2015; Series 1-17 were in collaboration with IEEJ.
- OGSS 18 after APERC independence, studies were conducted and written by APERC researchers.
- 19 OGS Studies since 2015 were published on the APERC website, and these were as follows:

# Oil and Gas Security Studies (OGSS) (3)

- The final report of the 20<sup>th</sup> OGSS (What are the Energy Security Implications of Recent Declines in Both APEC and Global Spare Petroleum Refining Capacity?) was presented at the EWG 68 meeting and is planned to be published on the APEC and APERC websites in the 1Q 2025.
- The 21st OGSS study themed "The Energy Security Implications of Declining LNG Investment" is currently being carried out. The key issues and preliminary findings of the study will be presented during the upcoming 8th OGSN Forum in Hong Kong, China on 8 April 2025.
- The topic on "The Implications of Underinvestment in Upstream Oil Sector Chain to Oil Supply Security of APEC" will be considered for the 22<sup>nd</sup> OGSS.

> Topics suggestions are discussed in the OGSN Forum and approved at EGCFE.
